



Invasion

Let's take a step back into time around 410AD and explore!

Children will revisit the causes and consequences of the end of Roman rule in Britain. They will highlight the impact of this, including the invasions of the Scots and Picts, decline of Roman ways, people moving from towns to hillforts, the end of the use of money, literacy declining and the lack of written records.

Children be given the opportunity to grow in confidence at historians by exploring the chronology of Britain between AD 400 – 1066, using a timeline that shows duration and overlaps of significant historical periods. They will also investigate the causes, consequences of the impact of the invasion of the Anglo-Saxons on Britain

Why did the Anglo-Saxons leave Scandinavia and invade our Kingdom?

By reading extracts from Beowulf, we'll learn how to write an intriguing setting that will grip the reader. Children will revisit historical learning about significant landmarks. They will be introduced to Anglo-Saxon period, while studying the captivating Viking period. Children will learn to read maps, locate countries and read four figure grids like real explorers. They will build their knowledge on historic art by extending their learning by understanding how to cross stitch
